




2022 allowed OhioMeansJobs Sandusky County to settle into a new normal after the COVID-19 pandemic. Remote work and flexibility continue to give staff a fulfilling work-life balance. Like many other employers, OMJ has experienced turn over and difficulties filling positions. However, all team members assisted to cover the OMJ center and with all WFD programs: WIOA, RESEA, Child Care, Work Activities, and HYPE Sandusky County. In addition, OMJ began focusing on helping county employers upskill their current workforce through IWT.

OVERVIEW OF 2022


- Ohio Workforce Case Management System (OWCMS) transitioned into the newly created Advancement through Resources, Information and Employment Services (ARIES) system.
- The OMJ Center completed a new cycle of ADA certifications.
- Reemployment Services and Eligibility Assessment (RESEA) continues serving unemployment claimants. In 2022 alone, RESEA selected 95 UC claimaints.
- Suzy Cole retired on 4/1, moving Jacob Berryman into the OMJ supervisor position.
- On May 9th, Morgan Lockhart (Bates) transferred from PSCA to OMJ and filled the child care licensing role Morgan also got married!
- WFD onboarded two new employees: April Middleton and Amber Wallace for child care eligibility and work activities, respectively.
- Throughout 2022, HYPE Sandusky County has grown exceptionally since bringing it in house July 2021. Hype had a total of 235 appointments in the OMJ center alone, not including visits with participants in the community.
- Pathway Home (PH) which launched in April 2021, has come to an end on 12/31/2022, with follow up continuing in 2023.
- Prevention Retention and Contingency (PRC) no longer falls under OMJ's umbrella, and instead returned to PA.
- Arcadia delivered a baby girl in April and was out on leave until June 2022.
- There has been a revolving door of Disabled Veterans Outreach Specialists (DVOP), but Mason Sieger has been a partner since September 2022.
- OMJ participated in the very first Sandusky County CEDS (Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy). This will slowly build throughout 2023.
- To better collaborate with our youth on mutual goals, HYPE enrolled the 5th cohort to Goal4 It!





APPRENTICESHIPS

OMJ Sandusky County assisted Freeman Company with establishing an apprenticeship program, sponsored by GOWBI, and is pending approval with the Ohio Apprentice Council. This is the very first apprenticeship submitted for Sandusky County. In addition, OMJ is also providing Incumbent Worker Training funds for each apprentice to further their education.

WAGE & BENEFIT ANALYSIS


The 2022 Wage and Benefit survey was conducted from September 2nd to September 23rd. In total, 44 responses were received from Sandusky County employers. In comparison, the agency worked with 3 counties on a 2021 analysis and outsourced the work to the "professionals", only receiving 34 responses for Sandusky County. Results can be provided upon request.

OUTREACH

OMJ Sand. Co. received additional Business Outreach Funds from GOWBI to better assist our employers. This allowed OhioMeansJobs to serve Freeman Company, Envases Ohio LLC, Auria Solutions, and Standard Technologies with two billboards each. In addition, served five employers with "Who's Hiring" ads through BAS Broadcasting. Who's Hiring provides radio and digital advertisement for Tri-County Tarp, The Bellevue Hospital, Amcor Rigid Plastics (Fremont), Capitol Aluminum and Glass Corporation, and Bishop Hoffman Catholic Schools.



Our team at OhioMeansJobs Sandusky County has started work on bringing an electronic billboard sign to our center! The billboard will be located close to the road, making it easily viewable. The goal is to advertise OMJ's services, job openings, and other events!


SUCCESS STORY


EXIT

2022 Total Child Care Expenses: \$2,951,565.66




1. Child Care eligibility transitioned into Ohio Benefits.




One participant received incentives for successfully finding and maintaining employment, as well as continuing sobriety!
